SAVE, SALVATION - Beginning with both "S" hands together in front of the chest, palms facing in, bring the hands apart to in front of each side of the chest, ending with the palms facing forward.

<u>SAVIOR</u>, <u>MESSIAH</u> - Formed by the verb sign "save" plus "person maker" - (first figure then Person Marker (second figure)

REDEEMER - Same as savior but with an "R" followed by Person Marker.

"The initial melody and lyric of this song came from my guitar player, Daniel Carson. He is constantly writing and recording ideas, and from time to time I wander over to his world and listen. Among several demos, was this melody and lyric idea for a chorus that jumped out at me. At the same time, I was looking to use the name 'Messiah' in a song. The two ideas seemed to fit perfectly.

Messiah is such a strong name for Jesus. For when you use that name, you are truly saying that He is the name above all names-that He is the Christ, the Son of God, the Chosen One, the Savior of the world.

That's why you will notice that every lyric in this song amplifies this idea of Jesus being the Messiah."

JESUS - Touch the bent middle finger of the right "5" hand to the open left palm; then touch the bent middle finger of the left "5" hand to the open right palm. Hint: The fingers touch the location of the nail holes in Jesus' hands.

GOD - Move the right "B" hand, palm facing left, from above the head downward in an arc toward the face. Hint: The hand comes down from heaven.



CHRIST, LORD, KING, PRINCE Beginning with the index-finger side of the right "C" hand touching the

Hint: Initialized sign following the sash worn by royalty.

LORD - use "L"; KING - use "K"; PRINCE - use "P"

PRECIOUS, VALUE

Beginning with the fingers of the right "claw" hand in front of the chin, close the fingers into an

"S" hand. Hint: Holding something tight in one's hand so as to keep it to oneself.



NAME, TITLE -

Tap the middle finger side of the right "H" fingers across the index-finger side of the left "H" fingers with a repeated movement, palms angled in.
